BOOMGATES

The access number for the Boomgates issued to you upon checking in needs to be entered at all times when entering or exiting the park. Even if you are following a vehicle in or out of the park or the Boomgate is up you still must enter your access number followed by the # key. This is a security code and if misused can restrict your access when entering or exiting the park.
